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Spartakiad at the Russian university of traditional art crafts: schedule and results

Mass sports work at the Russian university of traditional art crafts is implemented as a comprehensive system that unites curricular and extracurricular forms of physical activity. Its goal is not only to strengthen students' health, but also to develop psychomotor skills, stress resistance and team interaction, which is especially significant for future artists of traditional art crafts.

The structure of the university's physical culture and wellness activities involves the department of physical culture, sports sections in various sports, as well as the student sports club "Sportivnye khudozhniki" ("Athletic artists"), which coordinates mass events and encourages regular physical activity among students.

From June 4–7, 2026, on the basis of the Fedoskino Institute of lacquer miniature painting, a large-scale sporting event took place – the Spartakiad of the Russian university of traditional art crafts. The event became a bright and memorable occasion, uniting students, faculty, and staff from the main university and its branches.

Each of the nine teams included six participants and one representative. The competitions lasted for two days and covered a wide range of sports disciplines.

The organizers designed a program taking into account the specifics of the university: along with traditional sports, disciplines were included that develop coordination, precision and creative thinking – qualities important for future artists of traditional art crafts.

The Spartakiad program included: presentations by the branch institutes of the Russian university of traditional art crafts and their sports teams (Figs. 1²⁰, 2); a 4x60m relay race – a classic test of speed and team cohesion (Fig. 3); an athletic triathlon, including standing long jump, push-ups and abdominal exercises; darts – a competition developing precision of movement; table tennis – a discipline requiring quick reaction and coordination; volleyball – a team sport that fosters the development of skills for interaction within a group (Fig. 4).

Over the course of two days, athletes demonstrated their skills in various sports. The judges strictly followed the established rules and the competition results were carefully recorded.

After the event concluded, the results were announced and a ceremonial awards ceremony was held for the winners and prize-winners in both individual disciplines and overall team competitions.

Rating of Winners of the 2026 RUTAC Spartakiad:

1st place – Team of the Moscow Institute of traditional applied arts; 2nd place – Team of the Fedoskino Institute of lacquer miniature painting (Fig. 5); 3rd place – Team of the Siberian Institute of traditional applied arts.

In addition, there were demonstration performances in gymnastics and martial arts (Fig. 6).
